

## Fiscal Impact

Policy makers are now discovering the scope of the failed abortion-on-demand mindset regarding the harm to women. They are scrutinizing misappropriated state funds, attempting to solve one problem, but ignoring the underlying cause. Rather than full disclosure about the risks and complications of abortion, which includes breast cancer, public funding pays for the following two of many examples:

### 1. The cost of subsequent children born early/preterm labor.

The annual societal economic burden associated with preterm birth in the United States was at least \$26.2 billion in 2005 or \$51,600 per infant born preterm.\*

Medical Care: \$16.9 billion  
Maternal delivery costs: \$1.9 billion  
Lost household and labor market productivity associated with those disabilities: \$5.7 billion\*

### 2. Mental health treatment centers for: eating disorders, alcohol abuse & drug abuse.

Overall National Institute of Health (NIH) funding for FY 2015: \$30 billion

National Institute of Mental Health funding for FY 2015: \$1.463 billion

National Institute on Drug Abuse funding for FY 2015: \$1.028 billion

National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism funding for FY 2015: \$447.4 million\*\*



References more than 650 worldwide empirical peer-reviewed studies of the physical and psychological harm of abortion trauma on women.

**British Journal of Gynecology, May 2009** - "The adjusted risk of pre-term birth - meaning under 37 weeks gestation - **increased by 27%** after one abortion and **62% after two or more abortions.**"

**British Journal of Psychiatry** - "A recent meta-analysis concluded that women who had one or more abortions suffered an **81% greater risk of mental health problems** than women who did not."
